

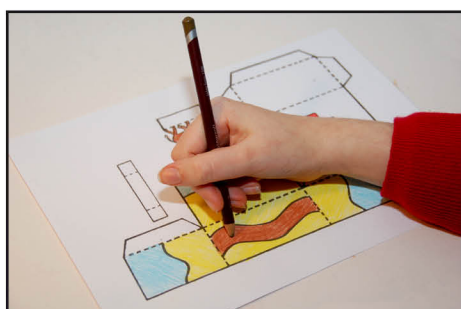

LUKE 10:25-37

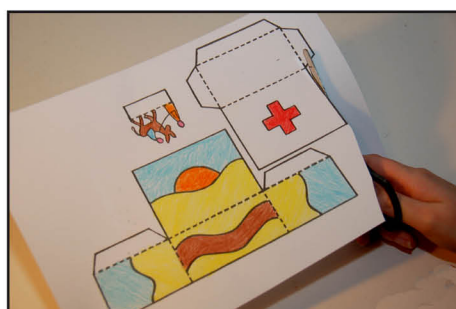


YOU WILL NEED:

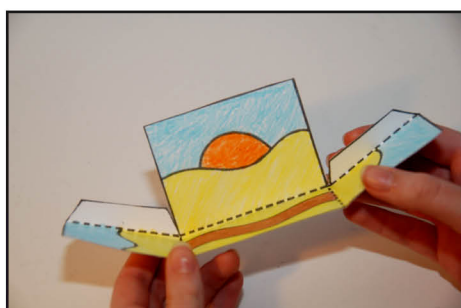
- TEMPLATE PRINTED ONTO WHITE CARD

STEP 1: COLOUR IN TEMPLATE



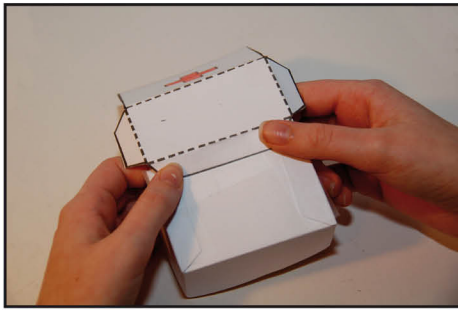
STEP 2: CUT OUT TEMPLATE



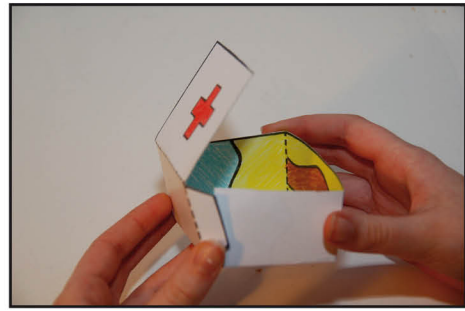
STEP 3: FOLD TEMPLATE ALONG DOTTED LINES



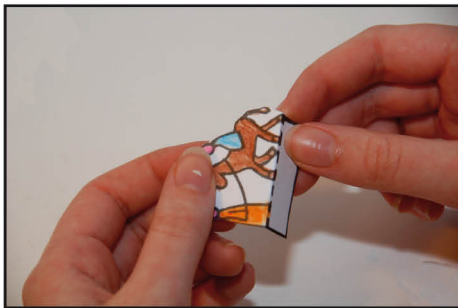
STEP 4: STICK THE SIDES TO THE BACK USING THE FLAPS



STEP 5: STICK EDGE OF LID ONTO THE BACK OF THE BOX



STEP 6: FOLD DOWN THE LID AND STICK THE SIDES TO THE SIDES OF THE BOX



STEP 7: FOLD DOWN FLAP OF FIGURES



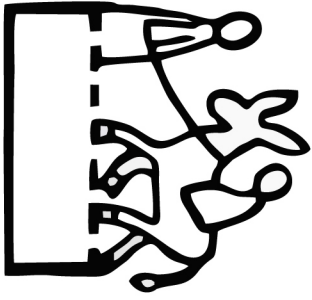
STEP 8: STICK IT INSIDE THE BOX
